

INTRODUCTION

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The National Council of Sports (NCS) Annual Report for the Year 2023/2024 is submitted in accordance with the requirements of the National Sports Act 2023, Cap. 151. NCS prepares an annual Work Plan, which identifies the priority activities to be undertaken over the financial year. This report therefore summarizes the performance of the Council during the period under review with particular reference to management and administration, finance, and technical departments, achievements, constraints and future strategies.

1.1. Mandate of the Council

National Council of Sports (NCS) is a body corporate under the Ministry of Education and Sports with the mandate as stipulated under the National Sports Act 2023, Cap 151; to promote recreation and sports for the citizens of Uganda. The NCS is linked to the African Union Sports Council (AUSC) and other relevant sports organizations to coordinate all sports activities in the country, in conjunction with National Sports Associations/Federations.

The Mandate of the Council as stipulated under the National Sports Act 2023 are as follows;

- 1) The Council shall –
 - (i) Recognize a sports discipline as a national sports discipline;
 - (ii) Register national sports organisations;
 - (iii) Promote and regulate the activities of national sports associations and national sports federations and where necessary, award medals, certificates of recognition, trophies and other incentives;
 - (iv) In collaboration with the national sports associations, national sports federations, local governments, educational institutions, communities and the private sector, as may be applicable-

- Make provisions for sports facilities, equipment and training;
 - Promote sportsmanship by searching for, identifying and developing sporting talent and ensuring discipline among sportsperson;
 - Create public awareness on matters of national interest through sporting events and on the benefits of sports to health;
- (v) Organise sports clinics and provide advisory and counselling services to athletes;
 - (vi) Develop, manage, operate and maintain the public sports facilities vested in the Council under this Act;
 - (vii) Establish, operate and maintain sports museums;
 - (viii) Approve the expenditure by national sports associations and national sports federations of funds and grants received from the Government;
 - (ix) Facilitate cooperation between and amongst national sports associations and national sports federations;
 - (x) In collaboration with the Ministry, facilitate the participation of Ugandan athletes and national teams in international sports competitions;
 - (xi) Approve the hosting of international sports competitions and sports festivals by national sports associations and national sports federation; and
 - (xii) Perform any other function as may be required under this Act.
- 2) The Council shall maintain registers of the national sports organisations registered under the NCS Act in a format prescribed by regulations made under the NCS Act.
 - 3) The Council shall cooperate with the Ministry and other government Ministries,

departments and agencies in the implementation of the NCS Act.

1.2 The Strategic Direction

National Council of Sports has a five-year strategic plan for the period 2020/2021–2024/2025 that provides a framework for all its operations i.e Vision, Mission as well as core values. It outlines the NCS focus over the plan period by elaborating the goal, objectives and planned outcomes as well as interventions.

1.2.1 The Vision

The Vision of National Council of Sports is **“A centre of excellence for promotion and development of Sports.”**

1.3.2 The Mission

The mission of NCS is to **“Maximising opportunities for all Ugandans to participate and excel in sports”**

1.3.3 NCS core values

Core Values are beliefs that the people in the institution hold in common and endeavor to put in action. The NCS therefore pursues the following core values:

To achieve the goal of the plan, NCS in line with the National Sports Act and NDP III will pursue the following objectives:

- i To develop, promote and control all forms of sports on a national basis;
- ii To build capacity of NCS to deliver on its mandate;
- iii To improve the global image of Uganda through increased branding, image building, cooperation, sports competitions, collaboration and partnerships.

MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

2.0 MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

2.1. The Council (Board)

National Council of Sports is governed by a Council composed of Seven members including the Chairman, with the General Secretary as an Ex-official. The Council/Board is appointed by the Minister of State for Sports with the responsibility of oversight and policy direction. The Council performs its functions through four statutory committees composed of Finance and Administration, Technical, Audit and Compliance, and Business and Investment.

The Hon. Minister of State for Sports, appointed a new Council in February 2024, to serve a Four year term. The Composition of the NCS Council is as follows;

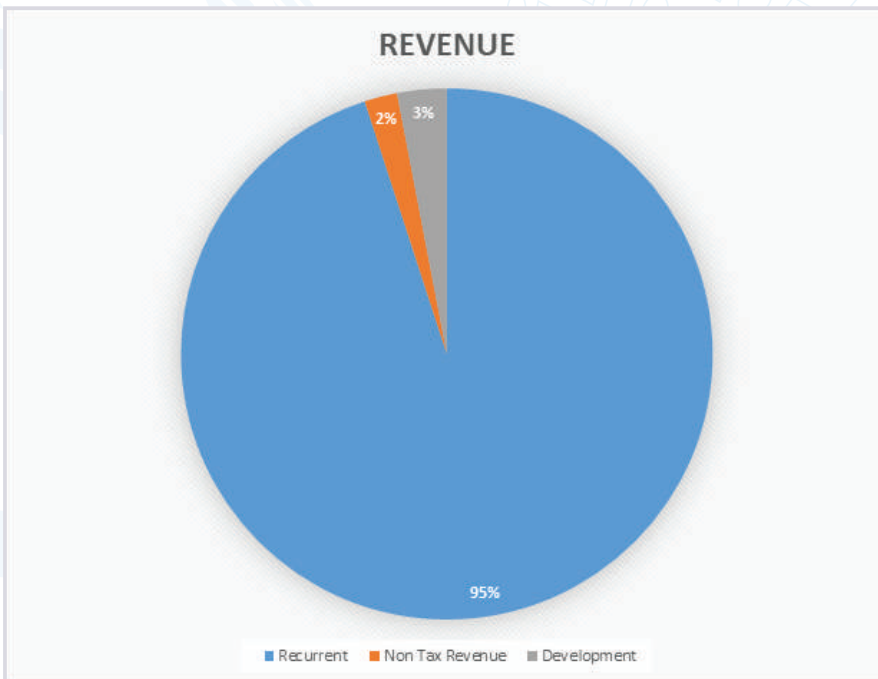
3.0 PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS:

3.1 Financial Performance

The Financial Performance Highlights of the Revenue and Expenditure for National Council of Sports (Vote 166) for the Financial Year 2023/24 is as below:

3.1.1 Total Revenue for the FY 2022/2024 – Vote 166

The approved NCS Budget increased by 3% from UGX. 47,812,199,000 FY 2022/23 to UGX. 48,902,189,000 FY 2023/24 reflecting an increase of UGX. 1,089,990,000. The increment was mainly on the account of Capital Development. UGX. 48,902,189,000 comprised of; Recurrent (GoU) UGX. 46,620,799,625 (95%), Non Tax Revenue (NTR) UGX. 781,386,375 (2%), and Development (GoU). UGX. 1,500,000,000 (3%) as shown in the Pie Chart below:



3.1.2 Releases/Expenditure Cash Limits for FY 2023/2024

Out of the expected expenditure cash limit for the FY 2023/2024 of UGX. 48,902,189,000, The Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development (MoFPED) released UGX. 223,527,189,000(457.1%) for Vote 166 depicting an over release of UGX. 174,625,000,000(357.1%).

3.1.3 Supplementary Budget Allocations for FY 2023/2024

The Ministry of Finance Planning & Economic

Development Released UGX. 23,000,000,000 for supplementary budget to meet hosting expenses for CHAN 2024 and facilitate preparatory activities for AFCON 2027. UGX. 14,864,270,976 was transferred to FUFA and UGX. 8,135,729,024 was Spent by NCS.

The Ministry of Finance Planning & Economic Development also released UGX. 152,000,000,000 (Uganda Shillings One Hundred Fifty Two Billion Only) for supplementary budget for 30% advance payment to M/S SUMMA for the construction of Hoima City Stadium in preparation for AFCON 2027.

The National Council of Sports paid M/S SUMMA TURIZM YATIRIMCILINGI ANONIM SIRKETI the contractor for works for the stadium in Hoima City the 30% being the 1st Invoice of USD 39Million of the USD 130 Million total contract sum.

However, UGX. 5,031,620,000 remained unspent out of UGX 152,000,000,000 warranted for payment of the 30% to the Contractor.

Accordingly, NCS requested for approval to spend the remaining balance of UGX. 5,031,620,000 on other critical costs which are not part of M/S SUMMA that Include:

- a) Cost of services, such as transmission of power, water, telecommunications for the site and other related costs for road diversion works and Environmental Social Impact Assessment.
- b) The cost of consultants' supervision, Contract Management as well as project monitoring. All those costs are part of the design suitability and value engineering report submitted by Ministry of Works and Transport to the Ministry of Education and Sports and National Council of Sports for implementation.

No response was received from treasury

accordingly the remaining balance of UGX. 5,031,620,000 was swept back to the Uganda Consolidated Fund.

1.3 Redevelopment of Kakyeka Stadium in Mbarara City

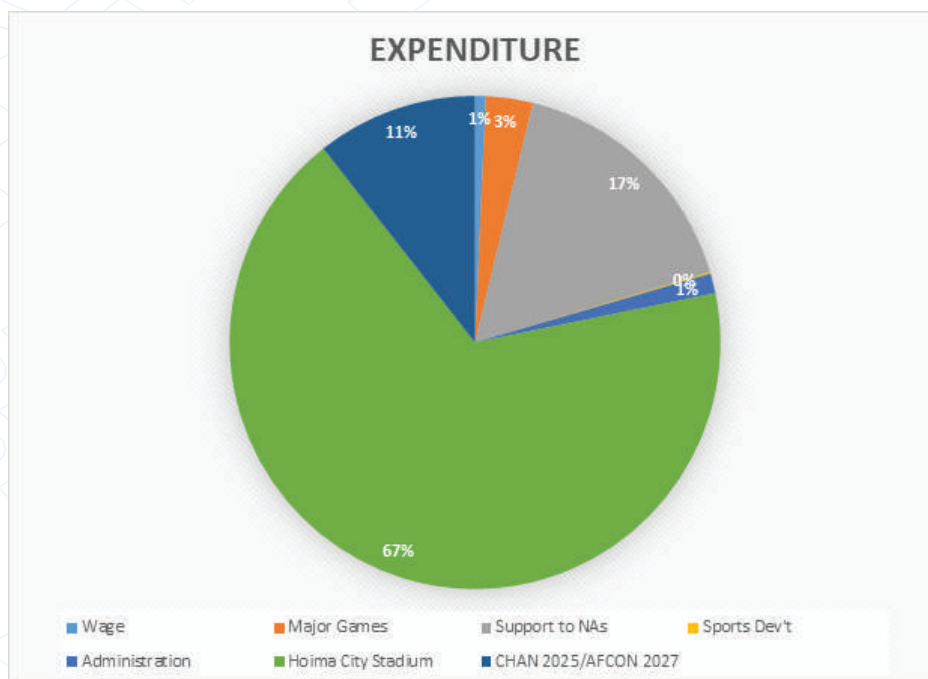
The National Council of Sports received an appropriation of UGX. 1,500,000,000 in the FY 2023/2024 for upgrading of Kakyeka Stadium in Mbarara City to an artificial turf. At the time of this allocation Kakyeka did not have a project code, therefore MoFPED temporarily allocated the said funds to the NCS retooling project which already had a code and would be transferred to the Kakyeka project once awarded a code.

NCS wrote to the MoFPED requesting that the Kakyeka funds be transferred from NCS Retooling Project to Kakyeka project whose concept at the time had been tabled before the Development Committee in the same Ministry, no response was received.

The UGX. 1,150,000,000 which the MoFPED released to NCS was swept back to Uganda Consolidated Fund at 30th June 2024.

3.1.4 Expenditure for the FY 2023/2024

Out of UGX. 223,527,189,189,000 transferred from treasury UGX. 217,345,569,000 (97.1%) was spent as follows; UGX. 1,608,542,000 (0.7%) was spent on Wage, UGX. 6,664,990,000 (3.1%) was spent on Support to Major Games and Representative Clubs, UGX. 36,031,249,018 (16.6%) was spent on Support to National Sports Associations/Federations, UGX. 290,000,000(0.1%)wasspentonManagement Oversight for Sports Development & Promotions, and UGX. 2,782,407,982 (1.3%) was spent on Administration Expenses, and UGX. 146,968,380,000 (67.6%) was spent on Hoima City Stadium and UGX. 23,000,000,000 was spent on CHAN 2024 and AFCON 2027 expenses as shown in the Pie Chart below:



3.2. Performance of the Council/Board

During the Financial Year 2023/2024, 03 Council/Board, and 8 Statutory Committee meetings were held respectively to provide oversight and guidance to the Secretariat in the execution of the NCS mandate. In addition, 9 Special and 3 Adhoc meetings of the Council and Sub Committees were conducted to handle matters of wrangles in conflicted National Sports Associations/ Federations and other matters.

3.3 Preparation and submission of the Budget Framework paper

NCS was able to prepare and submit its budget framework for the F/Y 2023/2024 in line with the revised planning framework.

During the year, National Council of Sports provided all required documentations to the National Planning Authority (NPA) and the Equal Opportunities Commission (EOC) and obtained the relevant certificates as required by law.

3.4 Partnerships

NCS held engagements with officials from the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development who are undertaking the construction of Sports Infrastructure within the refugee hosting communities in Uganda and these are funded by the Ministry of Lands

under the USMID project of the World Bank.

National Council of Sports hosted an international visitor Mr. Kabil whose company is the sponsor of the cricket BPL and discussed issues of mutual interest ranging from Investment opportunities to sponsorships.

NCS/Kyambogo University entered into an MOU for the University to provide land which NCS will utilise to construct sports infrastructure starting with a training ground for CHAN/AFCON and thereafter construction of a standard Cricket Oval Facility.

3.5 Stakeholder Engagements/Meetings

National Council of Sports conducted a stakeholder's engagement with a team from the PPDA on new reforms in public procurement like the E-GP i.e e-government procurement, the PPDA Act (As amended), the PPDA regulations (as amended) and other emerging issues.

National Council of Sports Evaluation Committee also met with M/S SUMMA, the identified contractor for the construction of Hoima City Stadium and MoFPED officials on the 2nd of April 2024 to discuss critical issues of the project especially mode of financing, sources of finance and delivery timelines.

National Council of Sports met the Technical Teams from the MoWT to come with the employers' requirements for Hoima City Stadium and training grounds for CHAN 2024 and AFCON 2027.

National Council of Sports together with Ministers of Education and Sports (Sports), Works and Transport, Defence and Veteran Affairs, management of Mandela National Stadium and the UPDF Engineers Brigade discussed CAF requirements and the initial CAF Inspection report for 2024 at Mandela National Stadium-Namboole.

3.6 Review and Formulation of Policies/ Guidelines

3.6.1 National Sports Law, 2023

H.E The President of the Republic of Uganda

on 17th August 2023 assented to the National Sports Bill, 2023 to become a functional law. The National Sports Law 2023 repeals the NCS Act of 1964 and empowers NCS with additional responsibilities that shall call for restructuring for the entity to deliver on its new mandate.

3.6.2 NCS Statutory Instrument No.38 of 2014

The Minister of State for Education & Sports (i/c Sports), Hon. Peter Ogwang appointed a Technical Committee of 11 people to spearhead the formulation the Statutory Instruments (Regulations) to operationalize the National Sports Act 2023.

3.6.3 National Physical Education and Sports Policy

The National Physical Education and Sports Policy was adopted and approved by Cabinet on the 25th September 2023, and is now pending approval of Parliament.

3.6.4 National Council of Sports Funding Guidelines (Draft)

The NCS Draft Funding Guidelines are still awaiting the finalization of the amendment process of NCS Statutory Instrument No. 38 of 2014, to which they are to be anchored. The Funding Guidelines were presented to the office of the Attorney General for clearance, however to date the same have not been cleared.

3.7 Reward and Recognition of Sports persons

The Presidential monthly stipend, through State House continues to be extended to top excelling Ugandan athletes with the aim of rewarding/appreciation of athletes who win medals at International Meets and consequently facilitate their training for future events. Since its inception in 2012, selected sports athletes are benefiting from the scheme until they retire from active competition.

The monthly motivational aspect allows for Gold medal winners to receive UGX 5million, Silver medalists UGX 3million while UGX 1million for Bronze medalists. The President has restated his commitment the Presidential stipend scheme with considerations to be made for Technical Officials/coaches of

excelling athletes and has encouraged the athletes to join the Uganda Armed Forces employment in order to sustain their sporting careers. The National Sports Act 2023 now mandates the NCS to administer the Rewards and Recognition Scheme that was before under the Office of the President.

Parliament of Uganda paid a special tribute to the national athletics team to the World Athletics Championships in Budapest, Hungary and the National Netball Team, the She Cranes to the Netball World Cup in Cape town South Africa in recognition of their splendid performances in which the Athletics team won two gold medals to emerge 11th in the world and third in Africa while the She Cranes finished 5th in World Cup and the best performing team from Africa at the Netball World Cup.

3.8 Information and Communication Technology

3.8.1 NCS Online Platforms

The National Council of Sports website is operational and can be accessed via www.ncs.go.ug. The sports web portal provides resourceful information, and daily reporting interaction with the general public for sports development. Equally, social media pages on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram under @NCSUganda1 are available. The platforms provide timely information to the general public on all sports related matters in the country and internationally. The statistics of the different online platforms is as below;

3.8.2 Publications

NCS continued with the compilation, printing and publication of the NCS quarterly magazine which was launched in 2018. The 15th volume issue was published and distributed countrywide to different stakeholders.

Through the magazine editions/volumes, NCS was able to document, showcase and publicize all the major sports activities that took place during the period. The publication remains a major milestone for National Council of Sports.

In addition, NCS was also to compile the annual end of year report for the Financial Year 2022/2023 detailing the performance of the council for the period.

3.9 Human Resource Management

3.9.1. Staff Establishment/composition

By the end of the period 30th June, 2023, the total staffing levels for the National Council of Sports was at fifty nine (59), of these, thirty-Five (35) are established staff and Twenty-Four (24) are support staff. In addition, out of the 59, Sixteen (16) are female and Forty-Three (43) male.

3.9.2. Staff Restructuring

Restructuring of the NCS Establishment Structure was concluded and approved by Public Service. The implementation of the new approved Staff Establishment Structure by public service took effect effective July 2024. The implementation of the new Staff Establishment structure would require redesignation of some positions while new positions will be filled both internally and externally.

3.9.3. Staff Performance Appraisals and Evaluations

Performance management is a continuous process where staff are assessed on agreed performance targets/standards. The objective is to improve performance. During the period, performance appraisals were conducted for all staff.

3.9.4. NCS Rewards and Sanctions Committee

National Council of Sports has also re-constituted the Rewards and Sanctions Committee to handle matters of staff discipline and recognition going forward.



FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

4.0 FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

4.1 Provision/Utilization of NCS Stadia/Facilities

NCS continues to provide access to stadia/facilities to the different National Sports Federations/Associations in the execution of its core mandate of sports promotion and development.

4.2 Maintenance of Facilities

During the period, management ensured that all facilities at the Lugogo Sports Complex were regularly maintained to ensure that they are in proper conditions to facilitate different sports activities for a number of Federations/Associations. All facilities are maintained by Grounds Staff.

Electrical repairs were done at the distribution board in the indoor stadium and additional security lighting was also added. All faulty plumbing fittings and fixtures at the indoor stadium and main building were repaired.

4.3 Maintenance of the Lugogo Cricket Oval

The turf for the cricket has been routinely mowed and all waste material carried and deposited away from the field. Similarly, the outfield and the dressing rooms were maintained on a regular basis to ensure that they are in perfect conditions for sports activities. NCS also continued fumigations of the grounds to control unwanted insect activity on the grounds. There was continuous mowing of the grounds and outfields.

4.4 Maintenance of the National Hockey Pitch

The turf of the hockey pitch continued to be regularly swept to remove any organic material especially fallen leaves from surrounding trees. De-silting of the drainage channels to ensure smooth flow of storm water through the channel was also done.

4.5 Maintenance of the Lugogo Tennis Courts

During the concluded year there was sewerage back flow at the ladies' toilets owing to a system blockage, this was rectified and the system is now working well

and construction of a manhole along the straight section through tennis parking was done.

4.6 Maintenance and Operation of Generator

The generator received fuel refills. It was also cleaned regularly, as was the surrounding area.

4.7 General Maintenance and repair of offices, indoor stadium and compound

Regular maintenance activities such as sweeping, mopping and dusting were done in the various offices and indoor stadium, where as slashing and weeding were done for the compound.

4.8 Redevelopment of the NCS Complex

National Council of Sports has completed the drafting of a Project Concept Note for development projects; Re-development of the Lugogo Sports Complex, Establishment of the Regional Academies of Sports excellence/National Sports Academy at Hoima and the Refurbishment of the Kakyeka Stadium in Mbarara.

4.9 Preparation of AFCON Secretariat

NCS supported the in procuring Air conditioners, generator, and CCTV cameras for the newly established AFCON Secretariat.

4.10 Other Sports Infrastructural Development Projects

4.10.1 National High Altitude Training Centre – Teryet

The first phase of the National High Altitude Training Centre – Teryet has been completed and the facility is awaiting to be launched by H.E the President for use by athletes and teams for training.

4.10.2 Construction at Nakivubo Stadium/Ham Stadium

Construction works at Nakivubo Stadium were completed and the grand opening was held on 01st June 2024. The project was implemented under a Public Private Partnership arrangement with Mr. Hamisi Kiggundu as the private investor.

4.10.3 Rehabilitation works at Mandela National Stadium

Phase one of the Rehabilitation works on the Mandela National Stadium are 95% complete and on 01st May 2024, the stadium was opened to the public with test matches ahead of international games. The renovation project increased the stadium's seating capacity to 38,000 and has been cleared to host CAF Champions League and Confederation Cup matches.



The newly renovated Mandela National Stadium was officially opened on 01st May 2024.

4.10.4 KCCA Phillip Omondi MTN Stadium

The redevelopment of KCCA Stadium has taken shape as the 2nd Phase starts. The project being undertaken by Sarjan Construction Ltd, once completed will reshape the stadium to a 11,000-Seater facility with a VVIP section, House Club Offices, dressing rooms, Hospitality areas, changing rooms, Anti-doping premises, Referees rooms and Media tribunal among others. The 2nd phase is expected to last 8-months to completion. The Government of Uganda provided UGX.10billion towards the redevelopment of the stadium.

4.10.5 Construction of Hoima Stadium

Arising out of the bid to host AFCON 2027, Government has offered to build a new stadium in Hoima City. FUFA has legally transferred the land to NCS and construction works on the stadium are on course. Hoima Stadium should be completed by December 2025 as per the CAF requirements.

5.0. TECHNICAL PERFORMANCE

5.1 National Sports Federations/ Associations Forums

In compliance to the NCS Statutory Instrument No. 38 of 2014, Regulation 17 (4) of the NCS Statutory Instrument, NCS through its Technical Department successfully organized quarterly Statutory National Sports Forums for the National Sports Federations/ Associations, on the 04th July 2023, 11th October 2023 and 29th June 2024. As per the provisions of Regulation 17 of the NCS Statutory Instrument, the forums were chaired by the Minister of State for Education and Sports (Sports), Hon. Peter Ogwang.

5.2 Support to Community Sports Programs

National Council of Sports continued to support community programs by providing basic sports equipment. During the performance period, balls, trophies and sets of jerseys were distributed for the period July 2023 to June 2024 as summarized below. 5.3 Registration and Recognition of National Sports Federations/Associations

NCS is mandated under Regulation 9 of the NCS Statutory Instrument No. 38 of 2014 to recognize sports Federations/Associations that meet the criteria to be classified as National Federations/Associations. The total number of NFA's duly registered/ recognized by NCS remained at 51 as at 30th June 2024.

5.4 Handling of Conflicts among National Federations/Associations

The NCS Technical Committee has had several meetings, as interventions with the wrangling Federations. Mediation efforts by NCS Technical Committee geared towards bringing sanity in the governance of the Uganda Draughts Federation, Uganda Lacrosse Federation and Uganda Floorball Federation have failed to resolve the differences between the warring factions in these federations.

5.5 Governance in National Sports Federations

During the year, there was change of leadership in a number of National Sports Federations bringing on board new leaders in the respective Federations/ Associations. National Council of Sports was represented at each of the assemblies by its staff drawn from the technical department who attended as observers but also offered support and guidance to ensure that the provisions of the respective Federation/ Association constitutions are upheld during the elections.

5.6 Hosting Rights

5.6.1 Pamoja AFCON 2027

The 2027 African Cup of Nations (AFCON) will be hosted jointly in Uganda, Kenya and Tanzania following the successful bidding process by the three East African countries under the "the East Africa Pamoja Bid". The Pamoja bid is a strategic fit, in line with African Union Agenda 2063, and East Africa Community Vision 2050 which aims to achieve sustainable development for all.

The Three heads of States for Uganda, Kenya and Tanzania are in support of the continental tournament and have showed their commitment to jointly hosting the tournament. The concept of Pamoja, which means "together" in Swahili, embodies the vision of the East African Community: to bring Africa together through the power of football.

Thanks to Uganda's bidding team that was headed by the Deputy Speaker of Parliament, RT. Hon Thomas Tayebwa that comprised of the Minister of State for Sports Hon. Peter Ogwang, NCS Chairman Mr. Ambrose Tashobya, NCS General Secretary Dr. Patrick Ogwel, and FUFA Officials.

5.6.2 CHAN

Uganda, Kenya and Tanzania have been awarded the hosting rights of the 2024 CHAN Football Championships as a pre-tournament test to prove the three states ability and capacity to host the AFCON 2027. This was another achievement registered in the year.

5.7 Flagging off of National Team to International Competitions

National teams from different national sports federations and associations were flagged off to represent the country in various international sports events that happened during the year.

5.8 Performance of National Associations/ Federations

During the period July 2023 to June 2024, Uganda continued to present herself as a sporting nation at national and international level and to this end recorded success in various sports disciplines as follows;

a) 13th African Games, Accra 2023

Uganda sent a team of 18 sports disciplines to the 13th African Games in Accra, Ghana from the 08th to 23rd March 2024. Team Uganda with electric performances successfully completed the continental games in 13th position overall and with a medal haul of 20 medals (4 Gold, 6 Silver and 10 Bronze), is the 2nd best performance for Uganda since 1979.

Uganda's swimming sensation Gloria Muzito with a new national record 56.01 put up an immaculate performance in the 100m freestyle final to win a bronze medals and Uganda's first ever swimming medal at this level.

The Uganda Badminton Team equally made history with Husnah Kobugabe winning silver in the women's singles and thereafter teamed up with Gladys Mbabazi to claim Gold in the women's doubles, while Fadillah Shamika also won a bronze medal in the women's singles.

Davis Niyoyita after years of hard work delivered 2 Silver and 1 Bronze medals in the weightlifting competition in the snatch,

total and clean and jerk to complete his medal hat trick. Cyclist Charles Kagimu raced through the hot wealth conditions of Accra to win a Gold medal in the individual time trial to the excitement of fans worldwide. The Uganda Bombers Trio of Semuddu Muzamir, Murungi Kassim and Innocent Tumusiime won 3 bronze medals.

In Athletics, Halima Nakaayi clocked 1:58.59 to claim a silver medal in the women's 800m at the University of Ghana Sports Stadium and in the women's 3000m steeplechase, Olympic champion Peruth Chemutai clocked 9:16.07 to come home second (silver medal) behind Kenya's Beatrice Chepkoech. In the women's Javelin Throw event, Uganda's Joyce Josephine Lalam won a bronze medal and set a new national record with her 57.01m throw.

The Uganda Rugby Cranes won the Rugby 7s Gold as the sport made its maiden appearance at the African Games. The Men's team accomplished the historic unbeaten feat in the round robin competition in which seven countries participated. The Uganda national women's 7s rugby team, the Lady Cranes emulated the men's team with a 29-0 win over Madagascar to seal their own Team Gold in a five-team competition.

Team Uganda continued their record medal harvest by adding Silver and Bronze medals in the Under 20 men's and women's Football competitions respectively. The Men's Under20 team, the Hippos in a pulsating finals fell to a last gasp goal from the Ghana team and settled for silver at the Accra Sports Stadium. While the Queen Cranes, the Uganda women's Under20 national football team overcame Senegal 6-5 on penalties after a scoreless draw in normal time in the bronze medal match at the Cape Coast Stadium.

The men's 3x3 basketball team lost their semi-finals to eventual champions Algeria, but took it out on Botswana in the 3rd place off, bagging Bronze. The Cricket Cranes won Uganda's final medal, sealing bronze in the T20 competition by overcoming Kenya in the 3rd place playoff match.

b) World Cross Country Championships, Belgrade 2024

Team Uganda finished 3rd overall with 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 3 Bronze medals to mark a fruitful

outing at the 2024 World Athletics Cross Country Championships in Belgrade, Serbia. Jacob Kiplimo retained the Senior Men's 10Km title in 28:09 while Joshua Cheptegei finished 6th to bag a Team Silver for the Senior Men's team. The Senior women's team, the junior women's team and the junior men's team each bagged a Team Bronze.

c) 19th World Athletics Championships, Budapest 2023

Joshua Cheptegei clocked 27:51:42 to win Gold in the men's 10000m event at the 19th World Athletics Championships in Budapest, Hungary on 20th August 2023 to complete a historic hat-trick becoming the fourth man in history to win back-to-back World 10000m following in the footsteps of Haile Gebresselaise, Kenenisa Bekele, and Mo Farah. Victor Kiplangat won Uganda's second Gold in the Men's 42 Km Marathon event.

Athletics

Team Uganda comprising of 13 athletes showcased their prowess at the 2024 CAA Africa Senior Athletics Championships in Duala, Cameroon to clinch 2 Gold and 4 Bronze medals; Leonard Chemutai and Loice Chekwemai both won Gold in the men's and women's 3000m Steeplechase events respectively while the Bronze medals were won by Tom Dradriga (men's 800m), Josephine Lalam (women's Javelin throw), Chebet Esther (women's 1500m) and Chemutai Belinda (women's 1500m).

Uganda Junior Team won 7 Gold, 5 Silver and 2 Bronze medals at the 2024 East and Central Africa Athletics Championships (EAAR) Under20 and Under18 in Zanzibar.

Jacob Kiplimo won a Gold medal in the 10km Valencia Ibercaja race finishing in a time of 26:48, below the current World record of 26:24. While Rogers Kibet was 8th with 27:33 in the same event.

Joshua Cheptegei won a Silver medal in the 10,000km road race clocking 26:53 in Laredo, Spain.

Sarah Chelangat clocked 52:04 to win the Cherry Blossom 10miles Run and thereafter posted 1:07:59 at the Copenhagen Half Marathon to set a New National Record in September 2023.

Isaac Kibet Isaac emerged 4th, clocking 1:01:36 at the 2024 Sevilla Half Marathon, while Juliet Chekwel finished 9th clocking 2:45:54 at the Buriram Marathon in Thailand on 27th January 2024.

Halima Nakaayi won a Gold medal in the 800m Metz Moselle Indoor Race clocking 1:59:15 World Lead, in February 2024 in France.

Halimah Nakaayi in a National Record time of 1:57:56 lifted Gold in the women's 800m at the 2024 USA Track & Field Los Angeles Grand Prix Los Angeles USA, while Joshua

Cheptegei claimed Bronze in 12:52:38 at the same event in Los Angeles.

Solomon Mutai won a Gold medal clocking 2:12:48 at the 2024 Ooredoo Doha Marathon in Qatar.

In February 2024, Stephen Kissa won a Silver medal at the Osaka Marathon clocking 2:06.33 to the finish line in Osaka Japan.

Naman Kipyeko won the 2024 Muscat Half Marathon crossing the finish line in 1:01.07 in Oman, while Ezekiel Mutai won the Paris Half Marathon clocking 1:00:42 in France.

Stephen Kissa won a silver medal in 5km clocking 2:06:33 at the 2024 Osaka Marathon in Osaka, Japan while Andrew Kwemai Rotich finished third in 2:07:52 at the Milan City Marathon in Italy.

Samuel Kibet lifted Gold finishing 27:56.66 at the 10km Oslo Half Marathon 2024 in Oslo, Norway.

Joy Cheptoyek (15.03) and Belinda Chemutai (15.05) won Silver and Bronze medals respectively in the women's 5km Festival of Running 2024 in Paris, France. Thereafter, Joy Cheptoyek clocked 30:08 and Sarah Chelangat clocked 30:26 to finish in 5th and 10th positions respectively in the women category of the Valencia race.

Maxwell Rotich posted a time of 1:00:06 to claim a Bronze medal at the at Prague Half Marathon 2024 in Czechia Republic.

Tarsis Orogot in a new National Record time of 19:90 won a Gold medal in men's 200m event at the Tom Jones Memorial in Gainesville 2024 and again won another Gold medal in men's 200m event, registering a (NCAA) leading time of 19:75, 3rd fastest time in Collegiate history, National Record, East African Record, Meet Record and School Record at the SEC Championships in Gainesville in May 2024.

Esther Chebet and Samuel Cherop both won Gold medals in the women's 5000m and men's 5000m events respectively at the Roma 2024 European Athletics Championships in

Rome, Italy Rome.

Peruth Chemutai clocked a National Record time of 8:55:09 to win a Gold in 3000m SC at the 2024 Prefontaine Classic of Wanda Diamond League, Hayward Field Eugene Oregon, USA and Jacob Kiplimo won a Bronze event in the 5000m event, clocking 12:40:96 at the Wanda Diamond League Oslo League in May 2024.

Hosea Chemutai (8:01.17) and Samuel Simba Cherop (8:01.58) won Gold and Silver respectively in the Men's 3000m steeplechase at the 2024 Meeting International Guadalajara in Espagne, Spain. In the men's 400m, Haron Adoli won a Bronze medal clocking 45:67 at the same event.

Oscar Chelimo won a Gold medal in 5000m in a time of 12:59:19 at the track night Vienna Event in Austria on Saturday 22nd June 2024.

On 20th January 2024, Uganda Athletics Federation in Conjunction with Jacob Kiplimo organized the 2nd Discovery Uganda Jacob Kiplimo Run, with the purpose of talent identification attracted more than 1000 participants from age group of 4years, 8years, 12, 13, 14, to 18 years old, at Boma Grounds Kapchorwa Municipality.

Archery

Uganda participated in the Hyundai World Archery Cup Championships in Yecheon, South Korea in May 2024 with Uganda's Solomon Semukete improving his ranking by 16 places to 400 worldwide.

American Football

Uganda lost to Kenya (14-0) in the first leg of American Football Africa Zone V Series Qualifiers at Kyadondo and again lost the return leg to Kenya (38-26).

Badminton

The Uganda Badminton Association sent a team of 7 Para badminton players and one coach to the Egypt International Para badminton Championships from 23rd to

28h January 2024 in Cairo Stadium. This championship was a Paralympic Qualification tournament to Paris 2024. Sarah Nazziwa (WH1) managed to win a bronze medal for Uganda and the rest of the players were eliminated in the knock out stages.

Uganda also participated in the All Africa Men's and Women's Team Championships in Egypt from which the Ladies team (3-2) lost to South Africa to settle for a Silver medal.

Team Uganda for the first time ever participated in this prestigious BWF World Women Team Championships 2024 in Chengdu, China with participants knocked

out from preliminary group stages. Uganda successfully hosted the Uganda Para Badminton International in July 2023 and Team Uganda recorded an outstanding performance with 1 Silver and 7 Bronze medals at the Lugogo Arena; Rose Nanserei (Bronze WS-SL3) Harriet Nakayima (Silver WS-SL4), Sarah Nazziwa (Bronze WS-WHI), Flavia Basuuta (Bronze WS-WHI), Ritah Asimwe/Elizabeth Mwesigwa (Bronze WD -SU5), Rose Nansereko /Sumin Mutesi (Bronze WD SL3-SU5), Sarah Nazziwa (Bronze WD WHI-WH2), Flavia Basuuta/Jennifer Kabuwo (Bronze WD WHI-WH2).

Thereafter, Uganda hosted the Africa Para Badminton Championships 2023 in July with Team Uganda claiming 1 Gold, 7 Silver and 7 Bronze medals at the Lugogo Arena.

Uganda's Sarah Anzia (WS-WHI) won a Bronze medal at the 2024 Egypt Para Badminton International, while Husnah

Kobugabe/Gladys Mbabazi won silver in the women's doubles event of the Cameroon International in August 2023 in Cameroon.

Team Uganda secured 1 Gold and 3 Bronze medals at the Benin International in September 2023; Kobugabe Husina/Mbabazi Gladys won the women's doubles

while Husnah Kobugabe, Fadilah Shamika, Tracy Naluwooza/Fadilah Shamika claimed the bronze in Benin.

Uganda hosted the Kampala Badminton International 2023 and Team Uganda recorded 2 Gold and 5 Bronze medals; Kasirye Brian won Gold in the Men's singles, Brian Kasirye /Lubega Muzafaru championed the men's doubles while the bronze medals were lifted by Kenneth Mwambu/Swaburah Sempiri (men's doubles), Expendito Emuddu/Augustus Owinyi, Husnah Kobugabe/Gladys Mbabazi (Women's doubles), Muzafaru Lubega/Husnah Kobugabe (Mixed Doubles), Ismail Mungufeni/Asumpta Owomugisha.

Uganda successfully hosted the Uganda International Series in October 2023 and recorded 1 Gold, 1 Silver, and 3 Bronze medals at the Lugogo Arena. Thereafter, Uganda hosted the Uganda Junior International in February 2024 and Team Uganda registered 1 Gold medal, 2 Silver medal, and 8 bronze medals.

Team Uganda won 1 Silver and 2 Bronze medals by Husnah Kobugabe/Gladys Mbabazi, Tracy Naluwooza/Fadilah Shamika, Asumpta Owomugisha/Kruthum Nalumansi at the Zambia International in November 2023. Thereafter, Team Uganda secured 3 Bronze medals at the Botswana International in November 2023; by Mohamed Rafi Fadilah Shamika, Kobugabe Husina/Mbabazi Gladys

and Naluwooza Tracy/Fadilah Shamika.

Uganda Badminton Association hosted the BWF Level 2 coaching course in June 2024 at Lugogo. The coaching course conducted under the stewardship of Instructor Dajee Annirao from Mauritius assisted by Dr. Ahmed Reda from Egypt, a certified BCA development officer for Arabic and English speaking countries and Bernadin Bokpe BCA development officer for French speaking countries. The coaching course attracted participants from Uganda, Nigeria, Egypt, Zambia, Lesotho and Eritrea.

Baseball and Softball

Uganda Baseball U12 Men won the 2023 Africa World Cup Qualifiers and qualified for the Baseball Under 12 World Cup in Taipei, China.

Basketball

Uganda hosted the FIBA AfroBasket Zone Five U18 Qualifiers with the Uganda Junior Silverbacks (Men) and the Junior Gazelles beating Rwanda (69:66) and (82:52) respectively to win the ladies and men trophies in an epic final at the NCS Lugogo Arena. The tournament had Uganda (hosts), Kenya, Somalia, Rwanda, Tanzania, South Sudan, Eritrea, Burundi, Ethiopia and Sudan take part.



The Junior Gazelles triumphed the FIBA Afro Basket Zone Five U18 Qualifiers at Lugogo.

Uganda qualified both the U-18 Boys and Girls 3X3 Teams to the FIBA U18 3X3 World Cup, scheduled for August 2024 in Debrecen, Hungary.

Body Building

Uganda's Yakub Bin Hassan won a Silver medal in the Mr. Physique Middle Weight Category at the 2024 Arnold Classic at the Greater Columbus Convention Center, USA.

Ryan Kayongo and Shamirah Mukyala emerged overall winners of the men's and women's events of the 2023 Mr. and Mrs. Uganda Championships in Buziga.

Boxing

The Uganda Bombers collected 2 Silver and 5 Bronze medals at the IBA AFBC Elite

Men and Women Boxing Championships in Yaoundé, Cameroon in July 2023; Waswa Ssali (Lightweight) and Erinah Namutebi (Welterweight) won the Silver medals while the bronze medalists were Ukasha Matovu (Welterweight), Ronald Okello (Lightweight), Solomon Kezaala (Heavyweight), Grace Nankinga and Emily Nakalema.

Uganda lifted 1 Silver and 2 Bronze medals at the Mandela African Boxing Championships in Durban, South Africa in April 2024.

Uganda's captain Joshua Tukamuhebwa secured a Bronze medal at the Africa Olympic Qualifier Boxing Championships (Road to Paris 2023) in Dakar, Senegal in September 2023. Isaac Zebra Senyange and Shafic Mawanda were knocked out in quarter finals while the rest of the team were knocked out in preliminary bouts.

Thereafter, the Bombers took part in the World Boxing 2024 Olympic Qualifiers in March 2024 in Busto Arsizio, Italy. Joshua Tukamuhebwa was knocked in the quarter finals while the rest of boxers were defeated in their first bouts.

Canoe and Kayak

The Uganda Canoe and Kayak Federation organized a joint Kenya/Uganda Canoe Kayak training and sprints competition at Buloba Forest Park in July 2023 with a capacity building session for coaches, athletes and leaders of the sport.

Thereafter, the federation partnered with Uganda Prisons and Uganda Police Forces to train officers and athletes in water sport disciplines, mainly, dragon boat and canoe kayak in June 2024 in Kigo.

Cricket

The Uganda National senior men's cricket team, the Cricket team historically qualified

for the 2024 ICC Men's T20 Cricket World Cup in the USA and West Indies in June 2024 and claimed their first win at the World Cup against Papua New Guinea by three wickets at the Providence Stadium in Guyana. Uganda's qualification came as a result of the Cricket Cranes lifting a silver trophy at the ICC Men's T20 World Cup Qualifiers from 20th November to 1st December 2023 in Windhoek, Namibia.

Uganda Cricket Association working closely with NCS received and hosted the ICC Cricket World Cup Trophy which was in Uganda from 25th to 27th August 2023. The trophy was also hosted by H.E the President of the Republic of Uganda at State House Entebbe.

The Uganda National Men's Team, the Cricket Cranes won the Africa T20 Men's Cricket Cup for the second time in a row in Benoni, South Africa in December 2023.

Chess

Team Uganda finished 6th overall at the 2024 BRICS Chess Championships in Kazan, Russia.

Talia Atubet won a bronze medal at the 2024 Africa Youth Chess Championships in South Africa.

Ronald Wabwire with an unbeaten record of 7/7 was crowned champion of the 2023 Jumuiya Ya Africa Mashariki Open Chess Championships in Nairobi, Kenya.

Cycling

Uganda's Trinitah Namukasa won a silver medal at the World Cycling Championships Tour de Femine in Burundi.

Aziz Ssempijja won a Gold medal in the category of Individual Time and Abraham Noor Lubega won a Bronze at the Zanzibar International Festival Bicycle Tour in May 2024 in Zanzibar.

Arnold Kaala finished in 6th position in the elite men's category and Muwonge Erukaan Kibuuka was 4th in the Junior category of the Africa Track Championships in Egypt.

Uganda Cycling Association organized the 2024 National Cycling Championships at Kapchorwa National High Altitude Training Centre Teryet. Lawrence Lorot in 4:37:37 won the elite (Men) 160km race followed by Paul Waswa Paul 4:38:54 and Pater Kato 4:39:27. The Women's 80km category was won by Trinita Namukasa in 3:14:30 followed by Kevin Nakato (3:19:49) and Miria Nantume (3:20:25) finished in 3rd position. The 125Km for Men's juniors was won by Lusike (2:51:11) followed by

Hatima Kiseembo (2:51:16) and Khalid (2:51:22) in the 3rd position.

Florence Nakamya from Masaka Cycling Club in time of 1:31.36 won the women's category of the Uganda National Cycling Championships 2023, Kevin Nakato (1:38.22) came second and Brenda Sikoya finished third. Uganda's Akot Harriet won the ladies singles category of the Tanzania International Darts Open in Dodoma in June 2024.

Deaf Sports

Larry Feni lifted 2 Gold medals in 50m breaststroke and 25m Freestyle events at the 2023 Special Olympics in Berlin, Germany.

Football

Uganda Cranes secured their first win in the 2026 FIFA World Qualifiers after defeating Somalia (1-0) on November 21st 2023. However, Uganda had lost its opening encounter against Guinea by 1-0. Uganda continued with a (1-0) win against Botswana on June 7th before drawing with Algeria (0-0) on 10th June at Mandela Stadium, Namboole.

SC Villa won the Uganda Premier League season 2023-2024 with 57 points. They sealed their 17th title of the Uganda Premier League after defeating NEC FC with (2-0) in the final league fixture at Njeru Technical Centre in Buikwe. Consequently, SC Villa will be representing Uganda in the CAF Champions League upon this victory.

Uganda emerged champions of the 2023 CECAFA Under18 Boys Championships after defeating Kenya (2-1) in an enthralling final in Kisumu, Kenya in December 2023.

Kitara FC won the 2023/24 Uganda Cup after defeating NEC FC (1-0) in the final match held at Mutesa II Stadium Wankulukuku. The winning goal was scored by Solomon Okwalinga to record a historical win for Kitara FC.

St. Julian High School Seeta triumphed the 2024 USSSA Boys Football Tournament, defeating Amus College Bukedea (3-0) in an epic final at Masaka Secondary School. This marks the first time St. Julian Seeta has won the prestigious schools' title that attracted a total of 64 schools across the country.

Golf

Uganda hosted the 2023 Victoria Cup in February 2024 with Kenya lifting the overall trophy. The 4th Nile Golf Cup at the Jinja Golf Course in February 2024 had the overall winner receive a return ticket to Nairobi courtesy of Uganda Airlines.

Gymnastics

The Gymnastics Association of Uganda hosted the Federation of International Gymnastics (FIG) Executive Committee meeting at the Speke Resort Munyonyo from the 25th February to 1st March 2024. The FIG President Morinari Watanari led the charge during the visit to Uganda aimed to emphasize FIG's commitment to supporting developing countries like Uganda in overcoming challenges and fostering growth in gymnastics.

Rhino Kabaddi Club defeated Lira West (52-32) to win the 2024 Northern Kabaddi Mini League in Lira with over 14 teams taking part in the tournament.

Lacrosse

The World Lacrosse suspended Uganda Lacrosse Association for the continuous governance and accountability issues with the association for 1 year and the 2 year they

will be on probation.

Arising out of this development, the NCS Technical Committee convened on the 5th December 2023, for Uganda Lacrosse to show cause why the certificate of recognition should not be withdrawn. However, ULA held an elective general assembly on 16/12/2023 and elected new office bearers.

Ludo

The Uganda Doves, the National Women's Team retained the women's title of the 2023 Africa Ludo Cup of Nations (AL-CON) in Pretoria, South Africa.

Motorsport

Uganda's Jas Mangat finished second at the 2024 Pearl of Africa Rally in Jinja with Kenya's Karan Patel winning the event that attracted over 37 drivers.

Team Uganda finished 5th overall at the Motorcross of African Nations in Cape Town, South Africa in August 2023.

Netball

The World Netball suspended all the executive Committee members on the 02nd November 2023, and put in place a Normalization Committee in line with the National Sports Act, 2023. The Normalization Committee was provided with clear terms of reference is operating independently without any interference from NCS. The tenure of their appointment is 6 months wherein, they are supposed to organize elections for new office bearers. The Normalization committee of four people is comprised of;

The Uganda National Netball Team, the She Cranes emerged 5th overall at the 2023 World Netball Cup in Cape Town, South Africa. The She Cranes defeated South Africa 49-47 in an epic win that had Uganda finish 1st in Africa and 5th in the World.

Paralympics

David Emong won Silver in the T46 Men's 800m event at the 7th International Para Athletics Meet in Marrakech and thereafter ran a time of 3:56:65 (T46 Men's 1500m) to qualify for the 2024 Paris Paralympic Games at the Para Athletics Championships 2024 in Japan.

Sarah Nazziwa (WH1) won a bronze medal at the International Para Badminton Championships in Cairo, Egypt in January 2024.

Nigo Mohamed won Gold and Silver medals in the legendary category at the Para Powerlifting World Cup Egypt 2024 in Cairo.

Oroma Peace T13 1500m clocked 4.41.8 to attain time beyond high performance set time of 05.02.32, and qualified for 2024 Paris Paralympic Games at the World Para Athletics Championships 2024 in Dubai (WPA Grand prix-Fazz International Para Athletics Championships) and again ran qualification time of 4:40:78 (T13 Women's 1500m) at the Para Athletics Championships 2024 in Japan.

Uganda's Denis Mbaziira Dennis (88kgs) qualified for 2024 Paris Paralympics and improved ranking from 13th position to 8th position world ranking in his category at the Para Powerlifting Championships Tbilisi 2024 in Georgia.

Ceaser Chandiga and Lukia Naiga were crowned the male and female champions respectively of the 2023 Nile Special National Pool Open Championships at Lugogo.

Rugby

Uganda Rugby 7s and Lady Cranes 7s participated in World HSBC Sevens Challenger 2024 in Uruguay, Montevideo in March 2024. The Men's team defeated Germany by 17-14 tries in match 5 and women's team won Thailand 7s by 15-5 tries in match 1. In overall performance the Men's team finished in the 5th position while Women's team finished 3rd.

Team Uganda bagged 6 Gold, 4 Silver and 1 Bronze medals with Entebbe Comprehensive School emerging overall winners at the East Africa Inter-Schools Skating Championships in Kakamega, Kenya. Uganda was represented by Entebbe Comprehensive School, Hillside School Academy, Mother Kevin and Christ the king.

Team Uganda participated in the World

Skateboarding Tour Park Olympic Qualifiers and Uganda's skaters improved their ranking; Trevor Kanyike ranks 5th in Africa, Rashid Serunjogi ranks 6th in Africa, while Ibrahim Mugisha 8th.

Team Uganda secured 9 Gold medals courtesy of Himram Kiggundu in the 200m and 500m events at the 2023 Eldoret Open Speed Skating Championships in Kenya.

Brain Bukenya, Trevor Kanyike and Calvin Muwonge took the 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions at the Uganda Skateboarding Championships in Mukono with over 100 participants taking part in the national event.

Squash

Paul Kadoma defeated Ivan Waswa to win the Prof. Tumusiime Mutebile Memorial Squash Tournament at Kampala Club from 29th January to 3rd February 2024.

Paul Kasirye Kadoma and Edith Wamalwa won the inaugural Kinyara Sugar Ltd Open Squash Tournament.

Team Uganda emerged overall championships of the CANA Zone 3

Championships in Kigali, Rwanda in November 2023. Uganda collected 3206 Pts for first position of the 10 participating countries while Tanzania with 2753 Pts was second and Kenya (1843 Pts) finished third.

Gloris Muzito won a Gold medal at the XVI Africa Aquatics Championships 2024 in Luanda, Angola.

Gators Swim Club Kampala emerged overall winners of the men's and women's categories of the 8th National Swimming Championships 2023 at Kampala Parents School.

Table Tennis

Uganda's Joseph Ssebatindira won two Gold medals in the Under11 and Under13 Boys Singles at the World Table Tennis Youth Championships in Qatar in January 2024. Prior to this, Joseph Ssebatindira won Gold in the U-19 Boys 2023 World Table Tennis (WTT) Youth Contenders in Cairo, Egypt.

Tennis

The 2023 Uganda Open Tennis Championships attracted a total of 144 players from USA, France, Congo DRC, Rwanda, Kenya, Tanzania, Ireland, Nepal, Great Britain, India, Burundi and host Uganda at the Lugogo Tennis Club in December 2023. Kenya's Ismail Kyangawa won the Men's singles while Tanzania's Shana Martin Mao lifted the women's singles. Team Uganda won the titles for the Veteran's Men's Singles (Edward Odockchen), the Under 8 boys (Joseph Gubya), Under 8 girls (Nambogo Lukiya), Under 10 boys (Shem Katende), Under 12 boys (Okello Isaac), Under 12 girls (Asiimwe Courtney), Under 14 boys (Latif Sendyowa) and Under 14 girls (Hilda Afoyiroworth).

Uganda hosted the J-30 ITF World Tennis Tour/Kampala Circuit-II at Lugogo Tennis Club in June 2024. Raguin Ntugamiri from Botswana championed the Junior Under18 Boys singles while the Girls Under18 singles was won by Segui Edmundson from Spain. India's Chaudhary Ayaan/Shaurya Swarup won the Under18 girls doubles while the Under18 boy's doubles were won by Khishnan Neha (USA)/Vaidya Saina Jayesh (Singapore).

Team Uganda championed the boys' event of the Under12 Eastern Africa Team Championships 2023 in July hosted at the Lugogo Tennis Club with Six countries taking part. Burundi came in second while Kenya was third. In the girls' event, Burundi emerged winners and Uganda finished 4th.

Entebbe, Uganda hosted the 2024 FISU World University Mind Sports Championships from 25th to 30th June 2024 with over 16 countries participating in events of Chess and Bridge. Poland defeated France to claim the Bridge victory and German finished third.

Volleyball

Uganda Volleyball Federation held a successful CAVB Zone 5 level II Referees course from 19th to 23rd February 2024 held at G-One Hotel Rubaga Road. The course targeted 5 zones and was instructed by FIVB referee Mr. Waleed Mohammed Abdel Samad from Egypt. It attracted 49 participants from Uganda, South Sudan and Rwanda.

Weightlifting

Lydia Nakidde won a Bronze medal in Snatch 66kg, at the African Senior Weightlifting Championships in Ismailia, Egypt in February 2024.

Roy Mubiru won a Gold medal (powerlifting) at the 2024 Arnold Classic Sports Festival at the Greater Columbus Convection Centre in USA in March 2024.

CHALLENGES

6.0 CHALLENGES

6.1. Taxes on Sports Equipment

International Sports Federations and Donors often donate to National Associations/Federations sports equipment to aid development of the respective sports and for use at both community and national level. However, the high tax on the sports equipment is a major hindrance to sports development given the limited budgets of National Associations/Federations. During the period NCS, had to clear taxes on equipment donated to Uganda Table Tennis Association, and Uganda Kabaddi Federation which money would have been put to other use for the promotion and development of the respective sports. There is need for a tax waiver on Sports Equipment given the fact that this equipment is not for profit making nature.

6.2. Inadequate Technical Capacity

Many Federations/Associations still grapple with the challenge of lack of personnel with adequate Technical Capacity and skills are internationally accredited which has continued to affect the promotion and development across the different sports disciplines. Capacity building for the technical personnel that are required like Coaches, Umpires, Referees, Managers and sports medical personnel is of paramount importance if Uganda is to produce excelling athletes across the sports disciplines, and improve on the performance so far registered in a few sports disciplines

6.3. Governance of Sports Associations

Governance challenges continue to affect the smooth operation of many Federations/Associations that has led to conflict and creation of factions. During the period, Uganda Netball Federation and Uganda Lacrosse Federation continued to experience leadership wrangles that have affected the growth of the respective sports. NCS has instituted mechanisms to mediate between the worrying the parties.

6.4. Limited Sports Facilities

NCS is mandated under the National Sports Act of 2023 to provide stadia and other facilities for sports activities. However, the

number and quality of facilities available is still inadequate. The country has only one standard indoor facility which is dire need of refurbishment to put it to the desired international standards. In addition, the Tennis courts and Hockey Pitch require major refurbishment and yet NCS does not have the resources to undertake the much needed renovations.

6.5. Legal Challenges

NCS is still faced with a number of legal challenges. The suits continue to drain and drag NCS in terms of time, human and financial resources which would have otherwise been committed to its core mandate of sports development and promotion.

6.6. Accountability and Transparency in National Associations

This has continued to be a major hindrance to the effective performance of NA's. The NA's that have received support from NCS fall short to submit accountabilities and performance reports which affects the performance of NCS. In certain instances, the accountabilities submitted are incomplete or doubtful on verification.

6.7. Delay in submission of required and submission of inaccurate data from National Sports Federations/Associations

Accurate is a foundation for policy making and budgeting. However, Many NA's do not have data on their programs, athletes, technical personnel among sets of data required. The absence of such data affects in the planning, funding and evaluation of activities relating to the sports sub-sector. In addition, when the information is requested for, it is submitted late and in some cases very inconsistent.

6.8. Inadequate staffing in Federations/Associations

Limited attention has been given to the recruitment, training, mentoring of staff in many national sports federations/associations and this has resulted into management and administrative challenges that have impacted the performance of these bodies. 7.0 STRATEGIES FOR THE NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025

National Council of Sports plans to undertake the following:

- ⇒ To engage stakeholders for the review of the National Sports Policy.
- ⇒ Establish District Sports Councils.
- ⇒ Engage stakeholders on the need for more funding for the sports subsector.
- ⇒ Re-register all National Sports federations/Associations in accordance with the provisions in the National Sports Act, 2023
- ⇒ NCS will continue to engage the National Federations/ Associations through meetings in order to build their capacity.
- ⇒ Undertake human resource training and development to enhance the capacity of NCS staff for better service delivery.
- ⇒ Review of the old strategic plan and formulate a new NCS Strategic Plan to be aligned to NDPIV.
- ⇒ To undertake stakeholder mobilization and engagement for the betterment of sports.
- ⇒ Pursue more opportunities for partnerships and collaboration, in addition to strengthening existing partnerships.
- ⇒ Pursue public private partnerships within and outside to attract more resources to the sector in order to address areas that have been underserved like infrastructure development.
- ⇒ Fast track on the on-going Capital Development Projects for CHAN/ AFCON and other emerging development projects in the sports sub-sector.
- ⇒ Collaborate with district local governments to enrich the community sports program strategy.
- ⇒ Collaborate with National Sports Federations/Associations to compile data on various sports programs and activities to inform decision making.

8.0 PRIORITIES FOR THE NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025

- (i) **2024 Paris Olympics and Paralympic Games:** Preparation of teams to qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympics and Paralympic Games will begin in earnest, and NCS shall put emphasis on ensuring that Uganda qualifies more athletes with a focus to bettering Uganda's performance at the last outing of the games.
- (i) **Policies/guidelines:** NCS will fast track the review of the National Council of Statutory Instrument No.38 of 2014 to provide the anchoring for all the funding guidelines whose formulation has stalled.
- (ii) **Grassroots Sports Development Programs:** NCS will continue to provide the necessary sports equipment and training of coaches, referees and umpires in order to spur community participation in sports.
- (iii) **Grant in aid:** Provide Grant in aid to National Associations in line with the mandate and priorities of NCS.
- (iv) **Capacity building Programs:** NCS plans to hold more capacity building programs for National Sports Associations in order to build/create awareness among its staff and members on the need for timely and quality financial reporting in the management of public resources.
- (i) **National Forum of Sports Associations:** As provided for under Regulation 17 of the NSI No.14 NCS will continue to hold the mandatory quarterly forum under the stewardship of the Minister of State for Sports to devise strategies to spur sports promotion and development in Uganda.
